



WARRIOR TRAIL (FOOTPATH) WAY MARKERS

- 1 FIVE BARROWS**
Ancient burial mounds past which Warrior would gallop
- 2 SIDLING PAUL FIELD**
Where young Warrior spent his early days 1908-10
- 3 BROOK CHURCH**
Nim, Jack Seely's first wife, was buried here in 1913
- 4 BROOK HOUSE**
Jack Seely and Warrior based here until 1925
- 5 BROOK HILL HOUSE**
Built in 1911/13 by Sir Charles Seely, Jack's father
- 6 BROOK**
Warrior shod by David Hookey, the Brook blacksmith
- 7 LIFEBOAT STATION**
Brook Lifeboat part of village life, Jack rowed in the boat
- 8 MOTTISTONE CHURCH**
Jack Seely's ashes and memorial in the side chapel
- 9 MOTTISTONE MANOR**
Home for Jack and Warrior until Warrior's death in 1941 and Jack's in 1947
- 10 THE LONGSTONE**
Neolithic ceremonial worshipping stones
- 11 BRIGHSTONE**
Local village where Warrior was local hero
- 12 - YAFFORD**
Warrior's birthplace in 1908.
